Answer 2: I love to travel. I love watching movies, and also reading about technology – I subscribe to technology magazines. I also spend quite a bit of time on social media – FB, Linkedin, Insta etc which helps me to some extent.
Answer 3: Like most in the IT industry, I read a lot about technology, and also try to learn new technology to keep me abreast of what is happening. With the changing trends in the job market, I believe picking up new skills is essential at my age, or I may get outdated

- What level of education did you complete?
Answer 1: I am an engineer
Answer 2: B.Tech in Electronics, have taken some certificate courses related to my job
Answer 3: Bachelors degree
- Which school did you attend?
Answer 1: JC College of Engineering
Answer 2: RV Engineering College
Answer 3: TKM College of Engineering
- Do you like learning new things? How do you learn new things? Do you use technology a lot?
Answer 1: Yes, but nowadays time is a premium. I try to do self paced courses, but most times not able to keep up
Answer 2: I like to learn new things, and try to pick up new trends in my job. I do use my tab a lot
Answer 3: Yes, I try to learn things that I love, though may not necessarily directly relate to my current job. I feel happiest when I learn. Due to travel, I rely on my mobile a lot for my studies, and MOOCs and online courses are a boon to me.
- What is your job role? Your title? What is your income?
Answer 1: Group Manager, 28 Lacs/ annum

Interview

- What are your aspirations – where would you want to be a few years from now?
Answer 1: Well, I would like to specialize in something hands-on. I am looking for a course that is credible, recognized by industry and helps me get some offers..
Answer 2: I am a creative, technology person stuck in a managerial role. I want to definitely move out of a 'roll-up' kind of job and work on some new ideas. So I would like to look at courses that are in-demand, and aligns to my strengths
Answer 3: I was doing a bit of studies – something that can help me switch careers. I am looking at the way things are shaping up in the tech industry – AI, data and such and feel like I am in the middle of a technology change where I am outdated. I do feel scared at times.
- How do you plan to meet your aspirations? What are you doing about meeting them?
Answer 1: I have started researching credible courses, and also planning to take a sabbatical once I decide
Answer 2: I will have to make time – weekends, holidays, nights – and learn online. I plan to do that.
Answer 3: I need to prioritize my learning time. But again, I worry if at this stage of my career would it make sense to do a hands-on course like DMND.
- How do you feel in your job – do you have opportunities to learn new things?
Answer 1: I have got comfortable with it, so there's not a whole lot of new things to learn
Answer 2: Can't say no – there are things I need to learn. But my passion seems to be elsewhere. Sometimes I feel hollow in the job.
Answer 3: Atleast 2-3 trips a month
- How is your work-life balance?
Answer 1: Let's not go there ☺
Answer 2: hmmm, I could do with some personal time
Answer 3: I do try not to get overwhelmed with work, and slot in some time for exercise and family.
